Interview with Virginia Ridgley

Social conversations often have a superficial theme, whether it's a general chat about the weather, the state of the nation, the neighbours' dogs, or those deeper "close to the heart" talks that friends share. But when you ponder on those discussions and look beneath the words spoken, you might develop an insight into the driving force behind those who are speaking. It was a pleasure to talk to Virginia Ridgley recently, who shared some of her life's events - the good and not so good parts of her history that has made her a woman with such varied interests and talents. Virginia's driving force is her interest in people and the natural world around her, her passion for continued learning, her courage to speak out, her belief in her own worth and acknowledgement of her limitations, and a much-deserved pride in the achievements of her life so far.

Virginia has been with U3A Redlands for over twenty years, first joining the Chess Group in about 1998. Prior to this she had been honing her computer skills with another Brisbane U3A group based in Wynnum when she heard from a friend that he was starting a Chess Group in Cleveland with U3A Redlands. This was much closer to home, so she joined and enjoyed meeting with this group for several years with Fred Langenberg tutoring. When Fred moved on in about 2003 Virginia took over as Tutor. She says in the first instance she accepted the role because it appeared no one else wanted it and she didn't want to see the group fold -"certainly not because I was a brilliant player - I wasn't".

At first, for her the Tutor's role was really the administration of marking the attendance sheets, setting up games, and then joining everyone playing for the session. The Chess Group still meets at the Cleveland Library where the very accommodating library staff provide the room and store equipment for their weekly games. There is no weekly cost to players, and it is generally a conducive environment for the players. From small beginnings over time this group increased to much larger numbers with some newer members needing guidance, so Virginia's skill in teaching became apparent. Virginia recalls a time when school children would watch through the window at the players and on occasions were invited to come in and join the group if they were keen to play or learn more about the game.

When asked what makes a good chess player, Virginia said there are a few points to be observed - aside from understanding the strategies of the game, players need to focus and concentrate and it's not a game for idle chatter - an analytical mind is a distinct advantage.

It was a strong group for many years but during Covid of course the library was closed so Virginia started to teach a neighbour how to play chess so she could continue to enjoy the game and keep up her teaching skills - and so a new enthusiast was born. After that eighteen-month hiatus the Group has gradually regained momentum. Virginia still plays but has handed the role of Tutor over to Kathryn Barry. Their Chess Group motto continues as it has for the past twenty-five years - "for those who want to continue plaving chess and those who want to learn".

Virginia's "continued playing and learning" is not limited to chess. Her home is a gallery of her own huge oil paintings, her garden is tended by the "compulsive gardener", she is undertaking projects in book binding old heritage volumes, and in upholstery and carpentry, she works regularly with the study group on migratory wading birds – to name a few.

Virginia's tertiary education in music, social work, psychology, and social research - much of this achieved while raising five children her life experiences as a professional musician, as a social worker, a rambler, a world traveller to places like Kakadu, Israel, and Nepal, has given her the desire for more knowledge and more skills. And she will do more - that is for certain.

I hope one day that Virginia shares the full story of all she has done so far with the rest of the world.
