contribution Beryl gives to these community groups.



Wings Over the Redlands:

Are you aware that two *Wirraways* crashed in the Redlands in World War 2? Do you recall in the 1950s the beginnings of the flying boat service from Redland Bay and Qantas and Ansett services through into the 1960s and early 1970s with other aircraft in the Redlands? You might remember that on 25 October 1971, the last flying boat took off for the last time. Perhaps you were there or flew in the flying boats. These facts and stories associated with them will be shared with us by Terence, a volunteer at Redlands Museum and President of No 23 (City of Brisbane) Squadron RAAF Association.

Small Steps Along the Way: Paul OATES

In 1969, Paul joined a small group of young Australian men who were sent to pre-independent Papua New Guinea to work as Patrol Officers, or Kiaps as they were known in the local lingua franca, Tok Pisin. Numbering only in their hundreds and working on remote outstations, often as the lone white man, they were the back bone of the Australian administration in Papua New Guinea. Their extraordinary experiences and achievements are little known in Australia. The sheer scale of what they did is still only poorly understood. They suffered the same death rate as Vietnam Veterans, yet they have never been adequately acknowledged in Australia. Paul will share with us his experience as a kiap and of Papua New Guinea.

Redland Museum has been in existence for over fifty years and is entirely the result of volunteer work and community support. Community Camera Alliance

Community Camera Alliance is an opportunity to register your closed-circuit television (CCVT) system with the Queensland Police Service. The initiative aims to promote the relationship between the community and the QPS by encouraging registration of CCTV systems to prevent crime and make the community safer.

<u>Can I register?</u> * Registration is open to any individual owner or operator of a CCTV system within police districts supporting the program.



How will my CCTV system be registered? * All you need to do is complete the registration form from the QR Code, and your voluntary registration will be stored in an existing secure database named QPRIME which is utilised and solely accessed by members of the QPS.

<u>How will my CCTV registration be used?</u> * Your registration advises police where a CCTV system is located. If police believe that your system can assist to solve a crime, you will be contacted and asked to help.

What information do I need to provide to register? * If you have a CCTV system at your home that you would like to register, we require your full name (as it appears on your driver's licence), your current residential address, your contact details and some details regarding your CCTV system. If you change your mind, you can notify us at any time to have your registration removed from the database.
