Guided Tour of Redlands Research Facility and U3A Redlands Garden



Back by popular demand, U3A Redlands organised a guided morning tour of the Redlands Research Facility in Cleveland, hosted by Shane Holborn, Facility Manager.

Shane informed and entertained us with stories about the many facets of research being undertaken at DAF (*Dept of Agriculture* & *Fisheries*). He discussed lawn trials being conducted for Wimbledon and the US Tennis Association; environmentally controlled glasshouses; hydroponics for plants and vegetables using nutrient rich solution and water; rows of sorghum to test resistance to bugs and pests; pilot hydrogen refuelling station, and Pongamia trees trial to measure their oilseeds for processing as high value biofuel and other protein nutrient products for cattle.

The morning was rounded off with a walk through the U3A Redlands Garden, an enjoyable morning tea in the Heritage Garden, followed by an inspection of our U3A Redlands Centre site and an update on progress by Janese Lowe, President. It was, unfortunately, a very hot day and a few of us "wilted" a little. This is definitely the downside of outdoor activities for Seniors Month in October, however, it was a very educational and social morning. *Thank you to Shane Holborn and his team.*



Exercise Safety Using Social Media

Social media platforms have become an integral part of our 'online' lives. Social media is a great way to stay connected with people; however, be careful how much personal information you share.

Here are some tips to help protect you when using social media.

- Privacy and security settings help you control who sees what you post check your settings often.
- Keep personal information personal the more information you share, the easier it is for someone to use that information or steal your identity.
- If you are uncomfortable with something a friend posts about you, let them know.
- Know what action to take if someone harasses or threatens you, take a screen shot, block them and report them to the site administrator and/or police.
- Update security software often it is the best defence against viruses, malware or online threats.
- Own your online presence only share your information with people you trust.
- Unique account, unique password separate your work and personal accounts.
- When in doubt, throw it out if something looks suspicious, do not open it and delete it.
- The golden rule also applies online post only about others as you want them to post about you.
