#### Personal safety tips

Police encourage all community members to be prepared and alert when walking in public, day and night. To help you be more confident on the street, here are some safety tips for when you are out and about:

- Be aware of your surroundings and people around you when you are walking on the street
- Act strong and confident body language
- Use assertive communication
- Use well-lit and busy streets
- Trust and act on your instinct if you sense danger
- Walk against the traffic direction to avoid cars approaching from behind
- Carry a mobile phone and some form of identification
- Avoid carrying a large sum of cash
- Avoid listening to music on high volume
- Speak to others about any incident straight away
- Safety in numbers avoid walking alone especially after sunset
- Store an ICE (In Case of Emergency) number in your mobile phone.
