Thank you to the Committee for the great preparation and to volunteers who helped on the day, which all contributed to a very successful event.



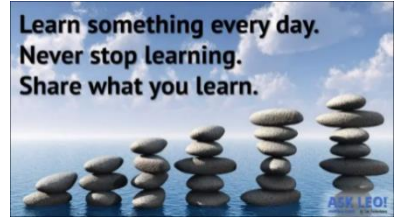

Interview with U3A Redlands Tutor



Shahin Master

Celebrating twenty years as a U3A Redlands Tutor, Shahin has an unusual tale to tell about her beginnings in this role.

As a woman who has lived in many places around the world, Shahin loves to meet the local community and to make friends with diverse groups of people.

Arriving in the Redlands in 1998, Shahin received a welcome letter from Mayor Eddie Santagiuliana. It was his custom to welcome new residents to the then much smaller Redland Shire. Shahin responded with an invitation to the mayor and his wife to dinner at Shahin's home – this was, and still remains, her custom to have new acquaintances come to her "meet the locals" dinner parties. Shahin entertains with good food, friendship, and conversation - getting to know people from all walks of life is one of her many passions. At the party the Mayor attended, he noticed the beautiful flower arrangements created by

Shahin to enhance the welcoming atmosphere of her home.

The Mayor had come from a family of flower farmers in the Redlands and recognised her talent in her floral presentations. Shahin had been asked if she would be interested in tutoring at U3A, but amidst the happy, noisy conversation of a social evening, the only words Shahin heard were "tutoring", "university" and "art". With her education and background these all seemed reasonably connected ideas although a somewhat challenging notion – teaching Persian art at a university. However, it eventually became clear what "U3A tutoring" really meant, and although Shahin is modest about her talents, she agreed to take on the role of teaching flower arranging and hopefully pass on whatever skill she could to others.

Imagine everyone's surprise when Shahin arrived at her first class of six ladies - if they had been expecting to meet a quiet florist to teach them the gentle art of flower arranging, they would have been thrilled to meet a lovely lady who is always laughing, and who creates a joyful, inclusive atmosphere. From those beginnings, with her love of flowers, her skill at creating beautiful arrangements, and her understanding of community, Shahin has continued to share this passion with her "artists". At one point some years ago, Shahin found herself time-poor with so many activities, including the further postgraduate study she was undertaking at the

University of Queensland. She thought she would need to retire from her U3A tutor's role. Her students were so upset to think she would be leaving them – they explained that those hours spent together were very special to them – to have something to look forward to each week, to enjoy the friendship of others and to create something beautiful. Those words from her students continue to be Shahin's motivation. Shahin acknowledges the generosity of local flower farmers and other businesses who provide flowers and florist materials at reduced, affordable prices, some even donating leftover stock, so the group can continue to enjoy this art form at little cost.

Class members take turns in collecting supplies and they meet weekly at the Cleveland Library for their creative activities.

Many of us will have seen their work at the recent U3A Open Day, past Theatre Shows and other U3A events where their lovely creations have featured and have been much appreciated fund-raising prizes.

For Shahin, tutoring at U3A Redlands has given her the pleasure of meeting so many new people, being part of a diverse community, and sharing friendship, laughter and creativity.

We wish Shahin and her class continued joy.

Writing for Pleasure

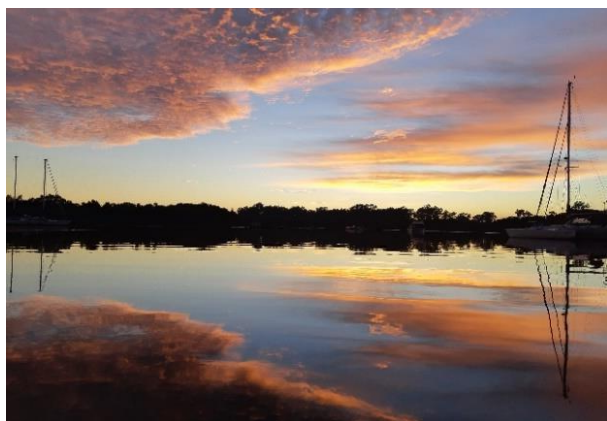
The pen is mightier than the sword.

Crime Prevention Corner

Help prevent the theft of vehicle registration plates

Ever wondered how to prevent your registration plates from being stolen?

Stolen registration / number plates are used by offenders to disguise the identity or legitimacy of motor vehicle/s they use when committing offences. Thefts occur when a vehicle is left parked in isolated locations including long term car parks, shopping centres or on-street-parking.

Here are some suggestions to reduce the risk of your registration plates being stolen:




- Secure your registration/number plates to your vehicle with tamper resistant, anti-theft, one-way screws.
- Park in a locked garage – where possible.
- Park in your driveway (remember to lock the vehicle; remove all valuables).
- Where parking on the street is unavoidable, try to park in well lit, populated areas.
- Check your number plates regularly to ensure your number plates are secure.
- Report all thefts of registration/number plates immediately to Policelink on 131 444.

Tamper resistant, one-way screws are a simple yet highly effective deterrent that are fitted with a standard screwdriver, but unable to be removed by one. These screws are available for purchase at most hardware and automotive stores. Questions related to one-way screws and their future removal should be directed to your local hardware store or point of sale.
