By now, all should have received an email notice that members attending our 'Special General Meeting' agreed unanimously (together with proxy votes) to **increase** our **2024 membership fees to \$40 Singles and \$75 Couples.** Associate membership (for those already a member of another U3A), was also **increased from \$5 to \$15** from 2024.

It has been 5 years since our last increase, and all agreed that we could not continue to wear operating losses for another year.

Many of you have already noticed that there is action at our build site in Delancey Street Cleveland. An official Groundbreaking ceremony will be held on Wednesday, 8 November 2023. We are expecting U3A members and invited representatives from all levels of government, plus the Gambling Benefit Community Committee, RDCOTA, Cleveland Rotary, and CDSHS Principal and Registrar. Building Project Update

Early on in Planning and Design (Stage 1), we were given an estimate of \$265k for the project.

As planning progressed and a lengthy quote process followed, we realised that this was grossly under-estimated. In answer to queries after the last newsletter, we confirm that prices have increased, and the building project target has increased to \$400k.

SANTA IS COMING EARLY!

Reputable local builder Cameron Marcon from Liona Constructions is the new Santa. He has promised to construct **'slab, frame, and roof'** (Stage 2) **by mid-December** and then 'To Lock-up' (Stage 3) by March 2024. So, yes things are really happening and there is some **urgency now** to seek assistance **to**

Betty Bowdler

English Country Dancing Tutor

I had the pleasure of meeting Betty and Chris Bowdler this week to learn more about their time with U3A Redlands. But their story is so much more than the last twenty-six years. They have been a partnership for over sixtyfive years, in marriage, in their love of dancing, in their raising five children, and in their adventure of coming to a new country with their young family to continue their They met in their home chosen careers. country, England, Betty newly graduated from teachers training college and Chris from his forestry studies. Chris had enjoyed Scottish dancing at high school and was looking to make new acquaintances after losing touch with school friends. Betty, fresh from college had also lost touch with many of her previous school group and by chance they both went along to an English Country Dance. They were introduced by the Director of the English Folk Dance and Song Society, a man well-known in England and the USA, Nibs Matthews. Over time Betty undertook workshops to further her skills in English Country Dancing and has continued to share her enjoyment with this dance style for these past many years.

The Bowdler family came to Australia in the late 1950's with their five small children. Chris took up a role as a Forestry Engineer in Tumut, the gateway to the Snowy in New South Wales. Chris was employed by CSR Pyneboard who sourced its timber from the surrounding forests of Batlow and Tumbarumba. Betty continued her career in primary school teaching in Tumut, and even with all the busyness of their lives, Betty and Chris continued to enjoy their dancing. Bettv contributed to workshops and demonstrations in Canberra and Wagga Wagga and many other regional centres with her constant enthusiasm for this lively dance form.

Forestry work brought Chris and Betty to Gympie in Queensland where they lived and continued their dancing for another fifteen or more years. They retired to the Redlands in the 1990's where Betty started tutoring in English Country Dance twenty-six years ago, initially for U3A Brisbane, and then the English Country Dance group became part of the newly formed U3A Redlands at its very beginning twenty-five years ago. Chris has been by her side organising the dance music for the group with Betty passing on all she knows of the dances that she has always loved.

The history of this dance form is guite different to the staid ballroom dancing of the last few centuries where orchestras played, and Lords and Ladies wore their finest attire in a very atmosphere. formal Country dances originated with farm workers and village maids, dancing with jaunty steps to the sounds of the accordion and a rhythm stick, in barns and on village greens. It is an expression of simple people enjoying their small moments of leisure with sets of dance moves passed on by demonstration and word of mouth, when farm workers moved from one English county to the next. Much of the dancing in the early days was to the accompaniment of Irish and Scottish folk sonas. When country dancing popularity surged again in post-war England in the nineteen-fifties much of the music came from that period. And now, even in the twenty-first century, there are still dances and music being written for those who love this style of dance.

Like many of our leisure courses in U3A Redlands, this English Country Dancing class has promoted friendship and learning, using the mind, while encouraging a wonderful form of physical activity. Sadly, the numbers of class attendees for this course have decreased, and for Betty and Chris it seems the right time to put away the music and hang up their dancing shoes and really retire.

They have passed on their enthusiasm for this dancing for more than six decades and in doing so they have inspired many others to share the joy – for this we th

U3A Redlands off to Japan in 2024

In the year before COVID reared its ugly head, U3A Redlands reached out to the senior's group (Kenyukai) in Kani City, Gifu Prefecture, Japan. Why Kani City? It is one of three sister cities to Redland City and the one with which Redland City has the most interaction. Letters and gifts were exchanged and a zoom meeting was held with Kani City officials but then lockdown put a stop to furthering our relationship.

Last year U3A Redlands was excited to offer a Japanese language class for the first time. Kathryn Tominaga, a very experienced teacher of Japanese who has spent many years living in Japan, stepped forward to take the class. An enthusiastic group meets on a Monday afternoon at Cleveland District State High School.

About eighteen months ago the idea of taking a U3A Redlands group to visit Kani City took root. A travel agent with expertise in Japan was found and contact with Kani City reestablished. Itineraries and costs were prepared in draft form and information was sent out to members. The response was very positive and there is a group of twenty U3A members and their partners, the maximum that Kani City can receive, off to Japan in April next year.

While a central theme of the trip is meeting with members of Kenyukai in Kani City, the U3A Redlands group will also visit Takayama, Kanazawa and Osaka on their ten day journey. An added highlight is expected to be viewing the famous cherry blossoms. John & Debra Barker

Crime Prevention Corner

3 Steps to protect yourself from scams

With scams increasingly becoming more complex and harder to identify, the ACCC advises people to follow these three simple steps to protect themselves from scams:

- 1. STOP: Don't give money or personal information to anyone if unsure. Scammers will offer to help you or ask you to verify who you are. They will pretend to be from organisations that you know and trust, like Services Australia, police, a bank, government or fraud service.
- 2. THINK: Ask yourself could the message or call be a fake. Never click on a link in a message. Only contact businesses or government using contact information from their official website or through their secure apps. If you're not sure say NO, hang up or delete.
- **3. PROTECT: Act quickly if something feels wrong.** Contact your bank if you notice some unusual activity or if a scammer gets your money or information and seek help from the following organisations:
 - IDCARE (www.idcare.org or 1800 595 160) and report to
 - ReportCyber (www.cyber.gov.au or 1300 292 371) and
 - Scamwatch (<u>www.scamwatch.gov.au</u> and 1800 595 160).
