Building Project

As mentioned in our August newsletter, the Steven Miles led State Government held a 'Redlands Community Cabinet' in Victoria Point on 28 August.

This event was attended by U3AR representatives; former committee member,

Dr George Chapman, Past President, Debra Barker and Vice President, Liz Sanderson.

At an arranged meeting with the State Minister for Seniors, Charis Mullen, the team asked why U3A Redlands had not received a reply to our May 2024 application for funding to complete the building.

It was disappointing to hear that the Seniors Department would not be providing capital infrastructure funding, as they only provided operating expenses. Also, this type of Seniors' Funding had already been given to one large organisation in the Redlands District, to the exclusion of all others.


