Ormiston House volunteers were run off their feet preparing Devonshire Teas and eventually had to put up the 'sold out' sign when the scones ran out. They were delighted with the attendance.

While final figures are still being calculated, U3AR expects to make approximately \$2500 profit. This is a great result for all who contributed – those who donated goods for sale, including home-baked goods, plants & household items; our Office Administrator, office volunteers and committee members who helped organise the event; those who volunteered on the Sunday setting up, marshalling cars, selling goods, cooking sausages and cleaning up afterwards.

Crime Prevention Corner

New Knife Laws - Queensland 2024

In an active step towards reducing weapon accessibility among young people, new laws will come into effect in Queensland from 1 September 2024 banning the sale of knives and particular controlled items to minors.

Particular controlled items such as double-edged knives, axes, machetes, sickles, swords and spears are also required by law to be securely stored prior to sale.

Under the new law...

- It will be an offence to sell knives and particular controlled items to minors.
- It will be an offence to use false identification to purchase these items.
- It will be an offence to advertise these items as 'suitable for combat'.
- Retailers will be required to securely store particular controlled items prior to sale.
- Retailers will be required to display signage regarding age restriction for sales.
