

Open Day Book Launch




Congratulations and thank-you to Elizabeth Jeffs and her talented Writing for Pleasure group for publishing a book of short stories, "Shades of Redlands".





Three Stages of Life - as described by Louis Putz CSC (1909-1998)

The concept of the three ages - Learning, Earning, Returning - represents distinct yet interconnected phases of life. Each phase focuses on specific priorities and activities that shape personal growth and societal contribution:

- 1. **Learning Age**: The first phase, spanning childhood to early adulthood, is dedicated to acquiring knowledge, skills and life experiences. It emphasises formal education, personal development, experimentation and mentorship from role models. Key questions in this phase revolve around discovering passions and preparing for future opportunities.
- 2. **Earning Age**: The second phase, typically occupying much of adulthood, involves applying the knowledge and skills gained earlier to build a career, generate income and achieve professional goals. This phase focuses on career development, wealth creation, family building and accumulating assets. It also reflects on aligning work with personal values and creating impact through professional achievements.
- 3. **Returning Age**: marks a meaningful phase of life where individuals focus on giving back to society and sharing their accumulated wisdom. Typically beginning in the later stages of one's career or retirement, this age emphasises contribution, legacy and societal impact. Key activities include mentoring younger generations, sharing knowledge through teaching or writing, engaging in philanthropy, building a lasting legacy and participating in community service.

Crucial questions during this phase centre on leveraging one's skills and resources for the benefit of others and considering the legacy to leave behind. It represents a time to reflect on life's achievements while fostering positive change for future generations.

The Returning Age underscores a balance between personal fulfilment and societal progress. By embracing this phase, individuals can achieve a profound sense of purpose and help shape a better future. Reflecting on these interconnected ages allows for intentional living that harmonizes growth, contribution and legacy.

The three ages, though presented as distinct, often overlap and evolve. They provide a framework for leading a purposeful life, emphasizing continuous growth, balance and intentional contribution at every stage.
